Prez David then introduced our Chair of the Day, **Betsy Brennan**, the President and CEO of the Downtown San Diego Partnership (among other prestigious San Diego institutions.) Betsy had the privilege of introducing her good friend, District 4 Supervisor Nathan Fletcher. Nathan hales from a small town in Arkansas, and learned at an early age the value of helping others. Nathan joked that his high school was so small its team colors were black and white as it couldn't afford a real color. Nathan spent ten years in the United States Marine Corps which introduced him to San Diego. He has run for mayor and served in the State Assembly. He has also been recently mistaken for Governor Newsom (not a bad thing) and a local politician who is being prosecuted for campaign crimes (not a good thing). In addition to serving as a County Supervisor, Nathan currently serves on a variety of boards and commissions including the Executive Board for the San Diego Metropolitan Transit System, the Regional Task Force on the Homeless, The Polinsky Children's Center, the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) Transportation Committee, and the San Diego Workforce Partnership.

Nathan Fletcher's priorities are focused on improving the quality of life for people who live and work in San Diego County. He is working hard to improve mental health services which involve homeless issues and substance abuse issues. Often the two are hopelessly intertwined and Nathan believes the solution is treating and not prosecuting those who need help desperately. The welfare of our children is also a high priority of his. Unfortunately, where one lives in San Diego, be it as an adult or as a child, can have dramatic impact on health and longevity of life. Finally, it is key to Nathan to protect the environment and tackle climate change; address housing affordability and improve the services for our homeless population; protect the rights of underrepresented and immigrant communities; and improve transit accessibility for people across San Diego County. All of this will require change by all of us, but Nathan believes we should take on bold issues if we want to make positive impacts on our world.
