The Rotary Foundation enjoys high ratings from charity watchdogs

Many philanthropists say it is more difficult to give money

away intelligently than it is to earn it.

As charities' financial practices make headlines, many donors are concerned about how their money is used.

Rotarians can be confident that their contributions to <u>The Rotary Foundation</u> are being well spent.

The Foundation has earned a grade of A+ from the American Institute of Philanthropy, a top rating of four stars from Charity Navigator, and full accreditation from the Wise Giving Alliance of the Better Business Bureau.

Only 2.3 percent of Foundation expenditures go to administrative expenses, and 7.3 percent go to fundraising. The Foundation focuses more than 90 percent of its spending on programs, far exceeding the threshold of 75 percent that independent charity-rating services view as a measure of high efficiency.

As many of you know, \$100 of the \$250 Club 33 annual contribution goes to The Rotary Foundation. Multiply \$100 by the number of members in our club and you can see the impact our contributions have on the good works Rotary is doing throughout the world — and we are just one of 33,000 clubs. We all can be proud to be "Rotarians."

the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Mission Valley. Former U.S. Olympian Mary Andrews, now a certified business and life coach, will be the keynote speaker. Sign up at the District's Website, http://www.rotary5340.org.

Our Chair of the Day, **Will Newbern**, swam his way from La Jolla Cove to the Liberty Station Conference Center to introduce our guest speaker, San Diego County Assessor, Recorder and County Clerk Ernest Dronenberg. Before doing so, he did give away some bedtime reading materials on the history of real estate in San Diego to our own **Pauline Hill**, or as Will described her, "the hardest working person in the room," as there were no visiting Rotarians present for the meeting.

Mr. Dronenburg then took center stage and, contrary to recent statements made by the elected official, decided to stick to the topic of how the region's property taxes are calculated and how his office is structured administratively. For those of you seeking a summary of how such fees are tabulated, I am sorry to disappoint you here. I was told when I took

the job of Rotator Editor that there would be no math and my slide rule is out for repairs. However, I can tell you a few things from Mr. Dronenburg's talk. First, county property tax revenues are up. The assessed property values throughout the region rose \$13.6 billion to a total of more than \$408 billion. That's due to property values rising enabling the county to reassess homes and businesses which received special dispensation a few years ago in response to the market crash. Mr. Dronenburg also pointed out the re-opening of two offices, expanding customer service hours and making more of his department's forms available to be completed and submitted online. He did this while simultaneously reducing costs by \$1 million over the past three years.

Mr. Dronenburg closed by also forecasting that many of us who have been in our homes for some time may see our property taxes drop. So I guess that means I can purchase a few more Hawaiian shirts to wear for the next couple of weeks until Rotary Casual Dress Month expires. My financial plan is working perfectly.
