

Please note that contributions directly to District 5340 (501c-4) are NOT tax deductible.

The second mechanism in which you can give is through the Rotary International Foundation. The Rotary Foundation Trustees have decided to prioritize contributions made to the Disaster Response Fund through April 30 to support disaster response grants for districts affected by the Ukraine crisis. These expedit-

ed disaster response grants can be used to supply water, food, medicine, shelter,

and clothing.
