

Please note that contributions directly to District 5340 (501c-4) are NOT tax deductible.

The second mechanism in which you can give is through the **Rotary International Foundation**. The Rotary Foundation Trustees have decided to prioritize contributions made to the <u>Disaster Response Fund</u> through April 30 to support disaster response grants for districts affected by the Ukraine crisis. These expedited <u>disaster response grants</u> can be used to supply water, food, medicine, shelter, and clothing.
